#### WHAT YOU MUST UNDERSTAND ABOUT SPELLING



- All people have natural talent. Some people are naturally talented at spelling. They don't have to even TRY to become good spellers. They are just born with THAT TYPE OF BRAIN. You might be one of those people. You might know one of those people. This is okay. Spelling for Life is for those people too.
- All people have things they need to work at. Spelling might be something you need to work at. It might be something you need to work at A LOT. This is okay too.
- Spelling for Life might not make you into a spelling bee champion, but knowing more about how spelling works and building up your own personal store of tricky words WILL make you into a Spelling Star.
- Spelling has NOTHING TO DO WITH how smart you are. If spelling is something you need to work at A LOT, you can still be a smart person. Some of the most successful people in the world had trouble spelling. Here are some examples:

- He is planning to take people into space

### Jane Austen




 She is one of the most widely read novelists of all time.

# How to improve your spelling outside Spelling for Life

• READ. Find things you like reading and READ THEM. The



more you see words, the more you remember them. Some people need only see a word ONCE to remember it. Some people need to see that word a hundred times or more to remember it. It's different for every person and every word. Reading will cause you to see as many words as many times as possible.

• WRITE. Practise writing using a pen or a pencil, not just a keyboard. There is something about writing with a pen or a pencil that helps your improve your spelling. Scientists have written about it.



• PRACTISE. Build your Tricky Word List and practise



those words until they're no longer tricky. You'll be amazed at how much this improves your spelling. You can also work out different ways to practise, either on your own or in a group. Spelling for Life has got lots of practice ideas.


